COVID-19 IMPACT 2020-21 Completed the full school year in-person with normal grading policies and curriculum. Online school was available without AP or honors courses; online dual credit courses were available through LeTourneau University as transfer credits. 2019-20 Normal curriculum and grading practices continued in a distance learning format through the 4th quarter. Late grade penalties waived. No semester exams were given, concluding the year one week early. Quarter 3 & 4 grades were each 50% of the semester average.
